## Prosecutor who led domestic-v

Since Kevin Wronko started the Domestic Violence Section of the Passaic County Prosecutor's Office, staffing has gone from five lawyers to four lawyers and soon may go to three lawyers. About \$200,000 in federal funding was lost in recent years. Wronko himself is now retiring.

With domestic-violence cases

the entire criminal case load in Passaic County, it sounds a bit daunting. That's an intake of about 1,000 cases a year. But like the resilient victims it works with, the Wronko created seven years ago will go on.

Resilience, after all, is what Wronko and his fellow lawyers have tried to instill in the minds and hearts of battered women too afraid to leave their partners and yet too unvalued to realize their own worth.
